Request under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOISA)

Thank you for your request date 1 August 2021 under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOISA).

Your request

You asked "Can you tell me who creates/owns the Cestui Que Vie Trust when children are signed over/registered by their parents when they are born?"

Response to your request

Under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOISA) a request is not valid if it does not, in accordance with section 8(1)(b), state the name of the applicant and an address for correspondence. As your request provides only your first name we do not consider it to be a valid request. Accordingly, we are not obliged to respond to it and we would usually ask you to provide your name (a surname and title, eg Mr or Ms, is sufficient).

However, we think it is simpler if we explain now that National Records of Scotland (NRS) does not hold any information relating to the 'Cestui Que Vie Trust' and we do not know who creates or owns it.

This is a formal notice under 17(1) of FOISA that National Records of Scotland does not hold the information requested.

Your right to request a review
