How do we define extremism?

"Extremism is the <u>vocal or active opposition</u> to our fundamental values, including democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and the mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs. We also regard calls for the death of members of our armed forces as extremist."






The Gap in powers
