Answers:

We have 2 Frameworks in place in commissioning.

The East Midlands Regional Children's Framework that we use to source residential placements and fostering placements.

We have an Accommodation and Support Framework in place for 16/17 year olds that we source semiindependent placements. These include care leavers where necessary and UASC.

DCC has an agreement in place for a housing offer/pathway for careleavers with Derby Homes.

We are also procuring a 5 bed block contract for 16/17 year olds who are at risk of homelessness or children in need, which will commence in May 2018.

The East Midlands Regional Children's Framework opens yearly in August for new providers and is due to be re-tendered in 2019/2020.

The Accommodation and Support Framework for 16/17 year olds is due to be re-tendered in 2019.

We also are procuring a 5 bed block contract for 16/17 year olds who are at risk of homelessness or children in need which will commence in May 2018.

We source our placements in the first instance from the Frameworks, we rarely spot purchase placements.
