However, I think I can say with some justification that other discussions about buses with relevant officers are far more positive - and I think Christian Van Der Nest would concur (otherwise we'd never have got the new bus stop).

This is especially needed as Lambeth Council has given up the ghost on lobbying for transport (bikes and binge drinking appears the Council's priorities), so it is the stakeholder group of 3 that I lead on that has provided the meetings and TfL-Community synergy in the past, not just on bus, but Tube and rail.

So I'd like to meet again, or arrange a public meeting in Clapham. What I have done is always to prepare an agreed agenda (though I have no idea of what questions the audience might ask) and allowed TfL officers to make their pitch. It's always a robust but profitable evening.
