Information Request - 3028133 - Collected Waste Data for Financial Year 2017 - 2018

I am responding to your request for information, which has been considered under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIR) and logged as case 3028133.

Your request is as follows:

Please find my request for information on Cheshire East Council Local Authority Collected Waste for Financial Year 2017 - 2018 (01 April 2017 to 31 March 2018). The specific data I require will show each of the following totals:

- a) Household dry recycling/reuse (tonnes)
- b) Household green recycling/reuse (tonnes)
- c) Household waste not sent for recycling (tonnes)
- d) Non-household waste sent for recycling/composting/reuse (tonnes)
- e) Non-household waste not sent for recycling (tonnes)

The definitions for 'a-e' are exactly the same definitions that CEC used when it compiled the following report - https://www.gov.uk/government/statistical-data-sets/env18-local-authority-collected-waste-annual-results-tables

I confirm that Cheshire East Council holds the information you have requested. However, I am unable to provide you with that information as I consider that the following exceptions apply to it.

The information requested is exempt from disclosure under Regulation 12(4)(d) of the Environmental Information regulations (EIRs). The information consists of material which is still in the course of completion, unfinished documents including drafts or incomplete data.

To use this exception we are required to undertake a public interest test. The matters which were considered in applying the public interest test are as follows:

Factors in favour of disclosure

There is always a general public interest in disclosing environmental information, derived from the purpose of the EIR. There may be an argument for informing public debate on the particular environmental issue that the information relates to.

Factors in favour of withholding

The tables for the data you have requested are not available until the end of November/early December when the Environment Agency have fully evaluated and approved them.

It should also be acknowledged that public authorities should have the necessary space to think in private. To this end, public authorities will be entitled to refuse access if the request concerns material in the course of completion.

It is considered that the greater public interest therefore lies in not providing the information at this time. In coming to that conclusion, the public interest in providing the information has been carefully weighed against any prejudice to the public interest that might arise from withholding the information; in all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information.

It is considered that the greater public interest therefore lies in not providing the information at this time.
