Dear Mr Lamming,

I am replying to your Freedom of Information request to the College, which was received by the Freedom of Information Officer on 10th January 2017

For clarity here is your original text:

I would like to know how much this college has levied in fines of all kinds (library, punitive, overdue payments etc. including "administration fees") since 2010, broken down by category of fine and year

Records of minor fines and disciplinary processes are not kept beyond the term of office of a particular Dean. Therefore, no consolidated record over the past six years exists and I am unable to provide the information you request.

Similarly, the College does not keep a record of library fines going back that far. In the academic year 2015/16 library fines totalled £1,793 and for the current year 2016/17 up until the end of January £594. It should be noted that some library fines are waived and fine money is often used to purchase library books and contribute to the general running of the library, including buying squash and biscuits for students during exam periods.

If you wish to request a review of this response, you should write to me at the above address in the first instance. The entire set of correspondence will be passed for review to another person in the College. If you are dissatisfied with the outcome of a review, you have the right to make a complaint to the Information Commissioner's Office.
