The cost of determining if the information is held, locating and retrieving the information exceeds the 'appropriate level' as stated in the Freedom of Information (Fees and Appropriate Limit) Regulations 2004. It is estimated that it would cost more than £450 to comply with your request.</p> <p>In order to ascertain the full number of complaints regarding cycling a large manual review would be required. The complaints referenced in the Twitter post were mentioned informally to officers dealing with other matters in and around the Neighbourhoods policing area, and, as such were not recorded.
