Dear Mr Woodruff,

Thank you for your request of 23rd June 2016 under the Freedom of Information Act (2000). Your exact request was:

"Please provide a list of all organisations that the DH has communicated with (via email, letter, phone, or email) on the matter of smoking control and smoking cessation in the last 12 months, whether initiated by DH or the organisation in question."

I can confirm that the Department may hold information relevant to your request. However, to comply with your request as it is currently framed would exceed the cost limit as set out in Section 12(1) of the Freedom of Information Act. Section 12(1) states that a public authority can refuse a request if complying with it would exceed the appropriate limit of £600 (which represents 3.5 working days). This represents the estimated cost of one person spending this time in determining whether the information is held, and locating, retrieving and extracting the information.

It may help if I explain that the responsibility for non-ministerial correspondence and phone calls lies with individual Directorates and policy teams and is not collated centrally. Therefore, to gather the information you have requested would involve contacting nearly 200 sections within the Department.

Please be assured that we are keen to assist and if you were to refine your request for information within more specific margins, for example, to ministerial correspondence, or to a specific policy team, then we may be able to continue processing your request. However, I cannot guarantee that Section 12 or any other exemptions will not apply to any information requested.
