Can I also check that the Mayor has seen the attached documents that set out the process and the response to the consultations through the listed building application (attached) - a process that involved and but also and the chair of governors from Cotham Gardens School (formerly Colston Primary). Cllr Asher Craig was unfortunately unable to participate, although was invited. Hopefully these documents begin to show that the choice of words on the plaque is the result of over 6 months of careful consideration following a brief set by school pupils. The key challenge has been exactly what are the 'facts' (given the degree or lack or lack of published research) and what 'facts' to include or exclude (given the cultural and political sensibilities) when you only have 100 words. Because we only had 100 words we always said that a bigger initiative was required to tackle all the issues that a project like this exposes. Could you also confirm that he is aware of the correspondence with Kevin Slocombe in January last year that clearly indicates that there was no interest in the project at the mayoral level - also attached. The fact that there was also no comment or further direction about our process when the plaque hit local and national news channels in the summer is also relevant.
