ACTIVITIES IN SUPPORT OF THE OBJECTS

We ask about activities because it is important that activities undertaken by the organisation are capable of furthering the charitable purposes.

On a number of occasions we find that the proposed activities, however desirable, do not relate to the purpose laid out but could properly support a different object. We are concerned to ensure there is no mismatch between objects and proposed activities.

We have to be satisfied that the organisation is not a sham nor intended to carry out activities which are not compatible with charitable status.

In addition it is helpful to us to have a proper picture of what the organisation is really intended to do.

We understand that for some organisations the activities can only be determined once funding has been received. This does not cause us a problem provided that you explain this to us and let us know your thinking as to the type of activities you will undertake. A business plan may be one way in which you could share your thinking with us. If your objects embrace "general charitable purposes" please let us know what approach the organisation is minded to take in, say, the first full year of operation. We recognise that ideas you may have at this stage may subsequently change.

One of the aspects we have to consider is "public benefit". If there is any available independent assessment or opinion as to the merit of what is proposed (particularly, but not only, for educational charities) this should be included as it will help us with our consideration of public benefit.
