I can confirm that the information requested is held by Birmingham City Council. I have detailed below the information that is being released to you.

Request

Could you provide information regarding the amount of money spent on road safety infrastructure, such as speed bumps, new road markings, installation of 20mph zones, etc for the Harborne ward and the amount spent on the North Edgbaston ward?

Response

£13,000 on Harborne Ward on road safety infrastructure ie 2 x traffic islands in Gillhurst Road junction Knightlow Road and Pereira Road. There was no spend in North Edgbaston ward.

In terms of 20mph schemes, the City Council has spent approximately £550,000 delivering a 20mph speed limit across residential areas in six wards, including Harborne. We do not have information on how the overall cost is broken down by ward therefore we do not have an exact figure for spend within Harborne. This scheme did not extend into North Edgbaston ward.
