Dear Requester,

Thank you for your email of 18th August 2020 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. Please see the responses to each of your questions below:

MMI is the acronym for Multi Mini Interviews.

1. How are International students ranked in the process of short-listing applicants for the MMIs? Is this solely based off the UCAT score and if so, can you provide the average UCAT score achieved by International students who were 'short-listed' for interview?

The College of Medicine and Health requires its school leaving candidates to sit the Universities Clinical Aptitude test (UCAT) admissions test. Both predicted and/or achieved A Level (or equivalent) qualifications as well as the overall UCAT score are used in the shortlisting process. In the first instance, candidates are tiered according to their predicted/achieved qualifications. A threshold score will be set for the overall UCAT score and this will be used where there are too many candidates in a given tier. Any candidate who falls in the relevant tiers will be invited to interview.

2. Is the International GCSEs (IGCSE) accepted and used when shortlisting International applicants? Is there a point-scoring system based on how well one does at IGCSE?

Candidates will be selected according to their predicted or achieved A Level or equivalent qualifications as well as their performance in the UCAT. We do not employ the use of GCSEs in our interview shortlisting process.

3. How will international candidates be interviewed in light of the current pandemic? Can you confirm whether the MMIs will take place on campus, or will they go 'virtual'?

MMI interviews will take place online. Most likely through Zoom.
