

We're now well into 2019 having welcomed new and returning students to the University for Semester Two and teaching is back underway.



University achieves QS Stars rating

Starting with some good news and the University has been awarded four stars in the global ratings system, QS Stars.

The scheme provides a detailed look at institutions against several different categories and gives them an

overall score as well as rating in individual areas. It aims to give international students an insight into worldwide universities and choose a university based on what is important to them.

Universities are scored from 0 to 5+ stars as part of the independent system.

Following its application and assessment, the University of Wolverhampton was scored four stars overall. It was also scored five stars for teaching, five stars for employability, two stars for research, five stars for internationalisation, four stars for facilities, three stars for innovation and five stars for inclusiveness

Well done to all involved in achieving the rating.



National Student Survey

The NSS is now live for students to complete. Results from the survey provide vital feedback to the University and helps us shape teaching and services we provide for students. It also plays a big part in contributing to our Teaching Excellence Framework metrics.

Last year the University achieved a 69.4 per cent response rate overall (just below the national average) and this year a target has been set to achieve at least 70 per cent.

The research evidence tells us that early completers are more likely to be positive than late completers so I would urge colleagues to do all they can to encourage eligible students to complete the survey as soon as possible.

All those completing the survey before 15 February qualify for a free drinks voucher and are entered in a prize draw for a £500 Amazon voucher.

The survey closes on 30 April 2019 and students should be directed to the National Student Survey website.

Sustainability

Last month I went out to speak to staff about the issue of sustainable development at the University. The sessions were well attended and there were some terrific points and debates had.

Clearly, there is an appetite for us to move this agenda forward and see what we can do as an organisation to be more sustainable. I am currently reviewing all the feedback from those meetings and as part of next steps will be seeking to set up a sustainability steering group to help drive this work forward.

Timetabling and Space Audit

We recognise the level of staff and student anxiety caused by the late rooming of the Semester Two timetable and apologise for this.

As you will be aware, we are investing in a new timetabling system which seeks to substantially improve the situation from September 2019 onwards. It remains very important to reassure students that we are investing in this area and to encourage them to check the online timetable regularly for updates.

A space audit will be conducted over the coming weeks, the outcomes of which will help us to more effectively utilise our teaching facilities.

Website Project Update

I am pleased to report that the project to implement a new look University website is now well underway.

Granite Digital, the company which successfully tendered for the redesign work, conducted a series of workshops with a range of staff groups, prospective students, businesses and alumni in last two week as part of its initial research phase.

This is added to the user experience and stakeholder work previously done which will be taken into the design phase of the project.

The aim is for the new website to be ready for this summer ahead of Clearing. In the meantime the current website is unaffected and it's very much business as usual.


Staff and Student Successes

Estates Update

Work is due to start on the new Cyber Security Centre in Hereford this month. The centre is a joint venture between the University, Herefordshire Council, the Marches LEP and the Hereford Enterprise Zone. It is due to open in Spring 2020 with the aim of bringing up to 190 high-value jobs and making the region a magnet for high-tech firms.

The University is increasing services and opening times for catering outlets and opening a new shop at Walsall Campus, following feedback from students and staff. A new Campus Store is now open in the Jerome K Jerome building and an additional café and bar will open in the Performance Hub during February. The outlets will open on a cashless basis with all card payments accepted and also our loyalty scheme Yoyo where added value can be achieved for regular users using the University's points scheme. The overall campus opening times will therefore support a seven day operation at Walsall.

Walsall Campus also successfully hosted the British Universities and College Sports (BUCS) Boxing Championships. The tournament saw male and female boxers from all over the country battle it out for national titles in 10 weight categories.

It is the first time the University has hosted the tournament, which took place February 1-3 in the



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
