We are also welcoming just under 5,000 new students and nearly 14,000 returning students and you'll have seen how busy the campuses have been today. Recruitment is healthy for 2017/18 and our full-time undergraduate numbers are generally sound, with an increase in our postgraduate students for the second year running as well as a growing apprenticeship portfolio.


Canvas



The 100 Masters campaign has been produced by Creative Black Country to identify contemporary skilled people from the region, helping to inspire future talent. Congratulations to Dr Paschal Anosike, Director of the University's Centre for African Entrepreneurship and Leadership (CAEL), who has been instrumental in a significant bid valued at a total of €1.397.750,00 which will support the education of entrepreneurs in Africa. The University has been selected as the only EU technical partner to be involved, to oversee implementation through the African regions involved − East, South and Western Africa. The seven African partners include Addis Ababa University (Ethiopia) (the lead institution), Makerere University (Uganda), Kyambogo University (Uganda), University of Ghana (Ghana), Milpark Business School (South Africa), Ministry of Education Uganda and the Private Sector Foundation Uganda.



Professor Mike Fullen, Professor of Soil Technology, Faculty of Science and Engineering, has been selected as the winner of the Caiyun Award of Yunnan Province, China – the highest award for foreign experts working in the Province.

Revised timescales for quality processes

In May 2017, University Academic Enhancement Committee approved revised timescales for processes including Validation, Accreditation, Approval and Deletion, Curriculum Review, Periodic Review and Modifications. There have been a number of internal and external drivers for this activity and it has therefore been necessary to adjust our internal deadlines to meet these demands. We will now be closing validation, approval and modification activity by 31 May each year, for delivery from September of the following year – for example, for a new course to be delivered from Semester 1 2019/20, activity would need to be closed 31 May 2018. A new entrance is being created in the Wulfruna Building, City Campus which will provide dedicated access to Chancellor's Hall – this work is scheduled for completion in November 2017. This will radically change the accessibility to this building.

Clegg Construction has completed the £10.1 million Science Centre at the University's Science Park in Wolverhampton. New tenants will start to arrive this autumn.
