I've just had a detailed conversation with the Planning Officer regarding our planning application. There has been a large amount of objections the council has received mainly relating to the loss of open space, however, the Open Space Assessment that we carried out has covered the loss of the open space and the council are not too concerned regarding this.

One problem that has arisen is the proposed access of Lindisfarne Road. The council feel that Lindisfarne Road is narrow, awkward to navigate to and has no footways whereas Grove Street they feel is wider, has footways and is easier to navigate to. We have therefore been requested to amend the plans to take the access road from Grove Street. Once the council receive the revised plans, further neighbour notification letters will be issued regarding the revised layout (14 days to comment) and hopefully we should receive the Decision shortly after.
