Comments On The Proposal...

The revised open space assessment shows privately owned farms and not open space. And if my memory serves me right there has been previous discussions of 20000 homes being built on said open

land contuing all the way to the school previously know Littlemoss High, also encorporating the land

surrounding Curzon Ashton Football club and running track.

The back field has been shown as unkempt waste land as opposed to an area of recreation however this is only the case because the current owners are neglecting to maintain the land so nobody can use it for recreation, to further there own gains. If they are not maintaining so far it is unlikely that once the owners have sold the houses they will maintain the existing land opposite.
