Dear Mr Wilkinson,

Thank you for your email of 6 January 2017, in which you request:

I request a copy of the chart headed "Regional Seismic Section through Lancashire", showing underground fault lines in the Bowland (SW Extn) and Formby basins, which was displayed on the wall in the area staffed by the OGA at the 'Regulators Roadshow' held in Aughton in October 2016."

We have considered your requests under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (**FOIA**) and, where relevant, under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (**EIR**s).

We no longer hold the information in the form that it was displayed at the 'Meet the Regulators' event in Aughton on [12th October 2016]. However, the image displayed on the poster was an interpreted regional seismic profile, 'UKOGL-RG-006', published by the UK Onshore Geophysical Library (UKOGL).

You may find this seismic profile, along with the location and preview images of all other seismic data that has been acquired onshore in the UK, in the Interactive Maps section of the UKOGL website which can be found at http://ukogl.org.uk/.
