Thank you for your email of 24 November 2019, in which you requested the following information:

As part of the proposed "Land north of Marden" development in Marden Kent, Countryside Properties (Countryside Ltd) have been in communication with you about the promotion of this site. Their "Vision Document (May 2019)" says the following under section 9.19:

"[]...early proposals seek to undertake works to improve the relationship between the Church and station and connectivity between the promoted land and village. Following discussions on site with Network Rail, this potentially includes:

• the removal of the existing public footbridge over the railway line or refurbishment" ... "aand [sic] the fitting of lifts to the existing station bridge which would function for both the public and station users. A letter from Network Rail confirms their support for such enhancements."

I would also like to see a copy of the correspondence between COUNTRYSIDE LTD and NETWORK RAIL about this. Please send me this.

I have processed your request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIR) as the information requested is environmental according to the definition

in regulation 2(c) of the EIR.¹ I can confirm that we do not hold the information you requested, this is because we have not had any correspondence with Countryside Ltd². We have only dealt with DHA Planning and all correspondence with them has been collated in FOI2019/00455 and a link to this response was provided to you in response to FOI2019/01326.

I have consulted with experts within Network Rail, whom have confirmed that we have had no further correspondence regarding the footbridge at Marden since April 2019.

¹ Please note section 39 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) exempts environmental information from the FOIA, but requires us to consider it under the EIR). In this case since your request refers to a measure affecting the environment, it is captured by the definition at regulation 2(c) of the EIR.

² Strictly speaking, regulation 12(4)(a) of the EIRs requires that we carry out a public interest test to determine whether the requested information should be disclosed. However, as is recognised by the Information Commissioner's Office, it is obviously not possible to conduct a public interest test on disclosure when the information that has been requested is not held.
