

Thank you

Yes, I saw the lock replaced swiftly on St Michael. Many thanks.

There are already reports of drivers mounting the pavement on St Michael. Might need to add something on the right side, looking toward Olive road, especially as this is the location with the highest pedestrian footfall due to local schools/nursery and nearby park.



I did some manual traffic counts over the weekend and I was shocked by the number of cars on a Sunday afternoon, within 15 minutes, who would have otherwise gone through. The other issue is that as of Sunday, the (resident only) road sign on Heber Road were still bagged so quite a lot of people entered and then realised it was filtered. The filter on Ashford is not on Google map or Waze yet.

Ashford:

56 cars (9 u-turned) - 13 turned from Olive into Heber, 17 came from Heber and turned into Olive (R+L), 17 continued on Olive (EW and WE).

3 Vans - 2 turned on Heber, 1 continued on Olive,

3 Motorbikes

24 pedestrians

4 cyclists

St Michael's road

14 cars

o van 1 motorbike 32 pedestrians 7 cyclists (including an entire family all on individual bicycle)

Agave Road (shocking speed there)

55 cars 5 vans 13 pedestrians o cyclist

Understandingly, you are more likely to speak to a pedestrian or someone cycling whilst walking about but out of the 7 people who came to talk to me over 90 minutes out there, all were in favour. Even those who would drive out of the LTN, knew this would be a bit annoying but fully understand why this is needed.
