This response is further to your email of 24 May where you requested sight of all correspondence from 12 May 2010 to 24 May 2013 between the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS) and the National Federation of Subpostmasters (NFSP), and between BIS and George Thomson, General Secretary of the NFSP, and our reply of 25 June 2013.

We have now completed the search of our records for the information we hold relating to your requests. A copy of the information which can be disclosed is attached. The information redacted is exempt under **section 40(2)**, in that it relates to personal data. Section 40(2) is an absolute exemption and not subject to a public interest test. Section 40 of the FOI Act provides an absolute exemption for personal data which then falls to be dealt with under the Data Protection Act. Personal data of third parties can only be disclosed in accordance with the data protection principles. In particular, the first data protection principle requires that disclosure must be fair and lawful and must comply with one of the conditions in Schedule 2 of the Data Protection Act. We do not think that it is fair to release the names of junior members of staff or third parties and do not think that any of the relevant conditions apply.
