Several years ago I was approached by the local council to conduct a registrar service from within my Post Office branch in the local council officials and was provided with all of the necessary computer equipment to allow me to provide this service. My customers found this very convenient and the service provided combined very well with the services I already provided through my Post Office. I operated this service, I believe successfully, for several years. Unfortunately following a decision taken within the local council they ceased the provision of this service at myPost oOffice and a decision was taken to take the service back in house to the Registrar's office at

Since the closure of **Management** egistrars Office due to this service being relocated within Lanark Registrar office resulting from **Management** cut backs leaving a void in the village and surrounding area making it extremely difficult and inconvenient for the local people who have been provided with this service.

Income for providing this service to the local community was approx £2,000, per annum payment of £25.00 for every second entry

5 years ago Visit Scotland decided to close **White Land of Tourist Office** as they said it was no longer viable. I contacted the then area manager the said and offered to provide a service at an agreed cost. She very firmly told me that they were not interested in the slightest.

I then contacted my 2 local councillors and an MSP (whom I had previous Post Office meetings with) and she put me in touch with (whom I had received a call from (whom asking for a meeting, her only stipulation was that POL must not be involved due to previous experience where they had tried to get a large slice of the cake for themselves (sounds familiar).

Visit Scotland ask me to provide the following:

- Space on the external door to display local accomposition providers for when the Post
 Office is closed.
- 1 metre of display space inside the Post Office for leaflets and information. It is also my
 responsibility to choose which to stock and to order leaflets. It goes without saying that
 it is my responsibility to ensure that this area is kept accessible and that the leaflets are
 kept up to date, tidy and well stocked.

My staff must have local knowledge as the main area of query is "things to do now that we are here". This generally involves:

- Walking for all levels.
- Childrens play areas,
- Places of Interest for adults and for children.
- Castles ,monuments etc.
- Shopping for the wives, distilleries for the husbands,
- Fishing and golf.
- Graveyards to assist in tracing relatives.
- Eating out where we have to be carefull as we must not recommend 1 place, we must mention them all.
- In the event of accomodation enquiries then we should hand out a Perthshire brochure
 and advise the customer to call the 0845 number and book centrally. We do not
 provide any booking service at all as that would require us to be "on line" through Visit
 Scotland.

The service that we provide is monitored by mystery shoppers once or twice a year.

Initially the agreed level of payment was £5,000+vat, this subsequently fell to £2,500+vat and is now £1,000+vat. This year Visit Scotland were keen to do a 3 year deal with me, year 1 £1,000, year 2 £500 and year 3 £0. I told them I wasn't interested and they told me (as they tell me every year) that they have some partner sites willing to provide this service free of charge. I lold them that was fine but I am not one of them.

Visit Scotland appear to have forgotten how much they are saving by us providing this service, furthermore I did offer to provide more, for example a booking service for accomposition, likewise buses and trains however they declined.

Thank you for your letter of 16 June and its kind words about the handling of the Postal Services Bill and my visit to your Conference. I was very pleased to be able to spend time there and have the opportunity to talk with many of your delegates.

I have noted that you will shortly be launching a major campaign to attract new Government work to the post office network and I hope that this will complement Post Office Ltd's own Initiatives in this area.

You asked me to raise three issues with Post Office Ltd (POL) on the Federation's behalf, the first being National Federation of SubPostmasters representation on the POL Board. As you know, the recruitment of a new Chair for the POL Board is currently in progress. I think it is both proper and important that new Chair is involved in any decisions relating to other new appointments to the Board and I will be having discussions about these with him/her as a matter of priority when that appointment has been made.

With regard to the timely and open supply of information and the scope for establishing a training budget for subpostmasters to improve their retail offerings within the network transformation process, I would suggest in the first instance that these points are addressed in the next Joint Dialogue meeting to see what progress can be made,

Future of the Post Office

It was good to meet you again recently and share our thoughts on the creation of a vibrant, sustainable Post Office network in the United Kingdom.

On the subject of our joint journey towards a mutualised Post Office Limited, owned and run by subpostmasters, staff and potentially customers, the NFSP are becoming increasingly disappointed with the lack of any real engagement with POL to emphatically get this mutualisation journey started. During our conversation you indicated that this was not an appropriate time for an NFSP representative to sit on the POL Board or Executive Team as the main Issue was around the separation of Royal Mail from POL. We would contend that this is exactly the right time for this to happen because we, as potential owners of the mutualised company, have a duty to satisfy ourselves that the interests of POL have been properly protected. Indeed our advisors Grant Thomton had identified this as a very important place of work that we should be involved with very early in our discussions with them.

Furthermore an announcement confirming NFSP representation would go a long way to building confidence with Subpostmasters. It would demonstrate that both Government and POL are serious about mutualisation. It would be seen by Subpostmasters as an act of good faith, instead we believe that POL senior management, while happy to engage on issues that would prove difficult or contentious to implement within the network (Network Transformation for example) are very uncomfortable with the idea of fully sharing information that would lead to them relinquishing any form of control.

We believe the next steps should include the following:

- Joint Strategic Partnership Board to meet on a regular basis to discuss and understand all the strategic and financial issues. These meetings and the requisite preparatory papers should be shared under the NDA. As a minimum, all parties would require:
 - All financial information to help us with our joint decisions.
 - All major contracts information to help us with our joint decisions.
 - All grant funding and EU procurement issues to help us with our joint decisions
 - A joint commitment to open book, transparent sharing of information (including client contracts) to help make informed decisions.
- NFSP seats on POL Board and POL Executive Team. We believe there is a strong case for a Director to represent subpostmasters and be a champion for, and to advance the journey to a mutually owned company.
- An NFSP office to be created at Old Street to foster an ethos of partnership
 working and building trust between the parties. It would also assist in resolving
 day to day operational issues more effectively.

We would also seek your input into the NFSP request to provide the following items through our commercial trading arm:

- Retall training for subpostmasters and agents to help them maximise their retail
 opportunities to their best advantage. We have many Subpostmasters who are
 excellent at running Post Offices, however we have identified that many
 Subpostmasters lack the neccessary skill sets to operate a really successful
 and professional retail businesses. We believe that our trading company is
 uniquely placed to assist our Subpostmasters maximise the retail potential of
 their businesses.
- Business consultancy visits to help subpostmasters and agents develop a hollstic approach to their combined post office/shop, it is important that they have access to a small team of experts who understand fully the synergy that exists between both the post office and retail elements of the business. Who better or more credible than existing subpostmasters who are already operating the most successful post office businesses?
- A proposal to operate around 30 of the existing Crown Office estate that will be regraded to become Post Office Mains. They would be operated under a new company formed to own, and manage them and backed by the NFSP Trading Company. We would take on these offices under the same type of commercial arrangement as, for example, W.H. Smith.

The Journey towards our mutual destiny will be difficult, but with your help, both POL and the NESP will work increasingly closely.

Mer George and Theorys,

Thank you for your joint letter of 19 December about the future of the Post Office.

I have read with interest your thoughts on how progress towards a vibrant sustainable post office network as a prelude to mutualisation might best be achieved. Whilst noting your views on the early appointment of an NFSP representative to the POL Board and Executive team, I remain of the view that it is inappropriate to appoint a representative of any stakeholder group or interest, however important, to the POL Board whilst we are in the process of reviewing and analysing the responses to the recent public consultation and considering the Government's response. Such a move would, I believe, be widely interpreted as pre-empting future decisions as regards a mutual structure. I also have to say that membership of the Executive Team of any business has to be linked directly to the holding of executive functions within it.

Having said this, the concept of arrangements for regular NFSP and POL discussion of strategic and financial issues within a strategic partnership structure and under NDA terms is one which I certainly think is worth building on. I believe POL would be receptive to developing further the existing working group structure into a Strategic Partnership Board. I recognise that provision of appropriate working space for the NFSP at Old Street can help strengthen the working relationship and that moves have already been made in this direction. I suggest that you discuss the scope for this in greater detail with the company.

I was also very interested to read your ideas for retail training and business consultancy visits to help and support subpostmasters develop their skills and maximise the potential of their businesses within the new operating models in particular. These are ideas which I think you should develop further and explore in greater depth with the POL management team. The key issue here is that POL expenditure delivers value for money outcomes which meet the defined needs of subpostmasters and the network. It will therefore be important that sound business cases, showing appropriate capability and expertise, should underpin these discussions. Similarly, your proposal with respect to any potential future converted Crown offices is one which I would encourage you to discuss in greater depth with POL in the context of the practicalities entailed such as, for example, TUPE provisions.

The journey towards a sustainable network and mutualisation will present all parties with some challenging issues on which we will all need to work constructively and creatively and I very much welcome your enthusiasm and commitment to this.



In December last year I selected on the horizon system that I had no immediate plans to sell and that I wanted to stay as a traditional office.

My personal circumstances(for which I did not have a crystal ball to see), have now changed which

means I have to sell on my office which comprises a Post Office and Spar Store.

My office went on to the market with Humberstones in May this year.

Since then I have been visited by formalisms from the PO who has said my office will become a local model upon transfer of a new agent.

I do not believe the new model will be suitable at my branch. We serve a high number of

pensioners

Who pay by cheques, and the stopping of cheques will cause a massive inconveinence to this hase.

of customers. I understand that I may also lose the selling of MVL's. We are the only shop standing

in this village, (last shop standing) very rural and hilly and cut off from other villages, we are the only PO offering car tax

in the area. We should be keeping all existing PO services not reducing. Our vilage serves approx. 3,000 people.

I believe this has been immediately detrimental to the ability of us selling the business. This has been

confirmed by **Exploration** himself. (who is happy to discuss this with you).

Potential buyers have concerns of losing the fixed pay and are concerned about the local model.

We begun marketing at the Humberstones advised us to drop the price to to reflect the PO salary rage reduction with the local model. Since this has been done we have had no interest. We now

are in the process of considering dropping the price again.

I feel that I am severely being disadvantaged by not being able to sell on existing traditional model,

I also feel frustrated and angry and that I am being forced to sell on a model that is creating a mass

uncertainty to potential buyers, and even more importantly, grave concerns that I am not going to be able to sell it on.

This uncertainty has caused my own health to deteriorate and I am currently under my GP, and being treated for depression.

I do feel I am being very disadvantaged by not being able to sell on as a traditional office, just because my own

personal circumstances have changed, and I only hope the PO will reconsider and allow me to sell on as a traditional office.

It was good to catch up with you last week and to discuss the big strategic issues facing the Post Office network. In fairness, 1-didn't think a 30 minute slot allowed sufficient time to do justice to these large issues.

On the specific subject of mutualisation, I promised I would send over some of my thoughts to help with the journey towards the Post Office transforming into a mutual company over the next period.

- That two or three implementation workstreams are put in place, to back up the commitment to mutualise
- That the most important implementation workstream would be the creation of a joint team to scope in outline what the future company model would look like - any commitment to implement mutualisation is always going to be impotent without at least a broad agreement of what it is that should be implemented
- Workstreams on things such as transformation, central cost reductions, public benefit, etc., should take place in parallel, but the work of the joint team cited above should not be delayed as part of a desire to work in sequence.
- Three or four meaningful meetings a year (1 hour), chalred by you as Minister, on progress towards mutualisation and looking at implementation workstreams, change of culture in the company (collaborative) and POL finances.

Finally Jo, although I didn't say it at the meeting, would you be prepared to commission a quick, independent review culminating in a very brief report, to summarise for all relevant parties the progress to date on executing the commitment to mutualise?

Dear George,

Thank you for your letter of 15 February, and for sharing your thoughts on how to best support the Post Office's journey to mutualisation.

I very much welcome the National Federation of SubPostmasters' constructive engagement with Post Office mutualisation and I share your commitment to this process. Positive engagement from Post Office's stakeholders, like the National Federation of SubPostmasters, alongside Government support, will be critical if we are to make clear progress towards the mutualisation of the Post Office by the end of this Parliament.

I have been pleased to see your involvement in the Stakeholder Forum and I believe strongly that this represents a critical initial phase in Post Office's mutualisation. The work of the Stakeholder Forum will shape what a future Post Office mutual looks like, by defining the public benefit purpose around which a mutual Post Office can be constructed. I understand that this work is progressing well, and I look forward to seeing the draft recommendations of the Stakeholder Forum shortly, prior to the wider stakeholder engagement planned for this summer.

I agree with you that Government is an Important stakeholder in the Post Office's mutualisation, with a significant role to play. But as I mentioned when we met, it is crucial that the Post Office and all of its stakeholders are custodians of Post Office's mutualisation. Government has consistently said that mutualisation must be driven from the bottom up.

The National Federation of SubPostmasters has been an enthusiastic supporter of the mutualisation of the Post Office and I believe it has a key role to play by working alongside, Post Office to encourage a similar level of engagement from other key stakeholders. For example, by actively supporting the Post Office in its transformation strategy, the National Federation of SubPostmasters can play a leading role in taking the business towards a commercial sustainable future. This can show by example how Post Office and key stakeholders can work successfully together towards a common goal,

The Stakeholder Forum's work is a <u>vital first step</u> in building a shared vision for a Post Office mutual and, once it successfully completes its work, the next step would be for the Post Office to develop a shared roadmap to mutualisation with its stakeholders. The National Federation of SubPostmasters will have an important role to play in building that shared roadmap and I have therefore passed on your views to Paula Vennells to feed into that process.

I also understand that Paula Venneils will be convening a meeting of principal stakeholders. This meeting will review progress that has been made towards mutualisation, and provide an opportunity to discuss the next stage of the process. I will be keen to see a shared understanding developing around key workstreams and milestones. These will all play a role in helping the Post Office and its stakeholders work together towards making mutualisation a reality. And so the meeting will be an important opportunity for you to share your views, to hear those of other stakeholders and to continue to help to shape the Post Office's journey to mutualisation.



I hope you're all well. We've finalised the our response to the consultation to mutualise the Post Office and an electronic copy is attached. Keen, as ever, to hear your thoughts.

Thanks so much for your input into developing the policy and for coming to see us the other week. The document has not changed much since you last saw it, aside for some drafting changes. They include, based on our discussion the other week, the insertion of a couple of references to the commitment to eradicating the losses of the Crown offices and a variation on David's suggestion to change the conclusion 5 about profit distributions. That now reads:

The mutual must be incentivised to ensure as much of the network as possible is sustainable without reliance on Government funding. Decisions to distribute any profits to members must take into account the cost to the taxpayer of the 'social'. uncommercial part of the network,

So rather than 'not coming at the expense of taxpayer funding', decisions should 'take account of it.

We'll be publishing our response on the BIS website at 09:30 tomorrow, alongside a press notice. We should all be at the employee ownership summit at that time and Will and I took forward to seeing you there.


