REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

I am writing in respect of your recent enquiry for information (ATI0000873) under the provisions of the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

"How much of a budget has been allocated for the Marine Conservation Zones (MCZs.) How much has the concept of HPMCZ or MCZ cost up to present day? The answer should include a breakdown of all funding to outside agencies and a breakdown of staff costs".

CCW's budget spent on MCZ work since 2009 (the year the MCZ Project commenced and the Marine and Coastal Access Act (2009) was passed creating MCZ powers) to financial year 2011/2012 has consisted of external contracts, software costs, and payment for a facilitator at a workshop for the MCZ Technical Advisory Group as follows:

MCZ Project Support – Staff support provided through Atebion Recruitment. Expenditure = £17,212.07

105 EPG 08: Highly Protected Marine Reserves: Defining Damaging and Disturbing Activities. Contractor Professor Callum Roberts. Expenditure = £7,920

175 EPG 09: Supporting Development of Highly Protected Marine Conservation Zones. Contractors Exegesis, SeaScope and Jon Moore. Expenditure = £24,797.70

184 MFG 09: Marxan Software Specialist Advice, Training & Support - Contractor – Robert Smith. Expenditure = £5, 197.80

267 MFG 10: Wales MCZ GIS reporting tool- Contractor – ExeGesis. Expenditure = £24,292.28

Software costs (ArcView single use license) = £1, 242.70

Provision of external contractor to provide facilitation support at the MCZ Criteria workshop of the

"How many staff within CCW are involved with the HPMCZ or MCZ?"

CCW does not hold detailed records of staff costs per individual areas of work.

In terms of numbers of staff involved in MCZ work, since 2009, three members of staff have worked regularly on MCZ work, as follows:

- 1 member of staff working approximately 95% of a 4 day a week post
- 1 member of staff working approximately 50% of a 4.5 day a week post
- 1 member of staff working approximately 25% of a 4 day a week post

A number of other members of staff have been involved from time to time on a more ad hoc basis; we do not have records of exact numbers.
