Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act)

The council has considered your request which was received on 12 September 2019 and our response to your questions is shown below.

Q. Where did the council obtain the information regarding the appropriation of payments case law which conflicts with the judgment in R. v Miskin Lower Justices [1953]?

The Judgment suggests that where the debtor does not request how the payment should be applied, the creditor is bound to appropriate "the whole of such payment to that part of the total amount due which first accrued" i.e. the oldest debt.

There are further comments that it was likely in that case the debtor would have wanted those payments to be "utilized in discharge of the original debt" and that that decision would depend on the particular facts of the case.

The council's understanding of the Judgment is therefore that where the debtor does not stipulate how the payment should be applied, the creditor shall determine how the payment should be applied.

The Council Tax system employs a sophisticated logic to correctly allocate payments to the appropriate debt and year where payment is made against an account with debts for multiple years and types outstanding. This includes -

- Matching payments against any instalment due, including multiples;
- Matching payments against the debt due on the most recent bill or recovery notice:
- Matching payments against any amounts due under a repayment arrangement for debts subject to a liability order;
- Matching payments against previous years arrears i.e. if payment amount matches the arrears it will be allocated against those arrears;
- Matching payment against future years instalments;



Matching payment based on a combination of above.

In addition any payment collected by an Enforcement Agent is allocate against the liability order for which they collected it.

If a payment made by a taxpayer is not allocate using the logic employed in the Council Tax system and the taxpayer has not indicated how the payment should be allocated then we allocate it against the oldest debt outstanding.

As such the council maintain that we do allocate payments in line with the principles of R. v Miskin Lower Justices [1953].

You are free to use any information supplied for your own personal use.
