




Q1 Do you currently receive council tax support?





I am a newly single parent to four young children and have previously worked in a well paid job for over 17 years since graduating. Due to huge changes in my personal circumstances I found myself in a position where I am currently unable to work and have to single handedly take care of and financially support my four children alone.

Council tax support has reduced my council tax significantly and without that some people may literally not be able to put food on the table for their family. This along with a reduction in universal credit may kill people, which I say with no exaggeration as unless you are in a position of poverty you can never understand. Cutting council tax support could lead people further in to poverty and open them to be more reliant on other council services such as housing which I am certain will cost the borough far more money than the cost of this scheme. The council's dire financial straits are not the doings of local residents and to consider making cuts to those who depend on this support the most is despicable.

However, in a banded approach, only those recipients whose income is very close to the lower threshold of a band are actually receiving a fair amount of council tax support relative to their weekly income. All other recipients will receive more support than they actually should, relative to their weekly income. This strikes me as a rather odd way of making the system fairer. The council should adopt an approach that makes council tax support directly proportional to weekly income, as is the case in the current system. If the current approach is deemed too complicated, it could be replaced with a simple linear function of the form y = kx + c, as is taught to every GCSE student. This would eliminate the problems associated with banding whilst still simplifying the process.



Disabled people, within or outside the workforce, are overrepresented among the poor and yet they're hardly "protected" in your proposals. Why is there no consideration of a working age adult being in low-paid work, or out of work, due to factors like having a baby or caring for a disabled relative? Many of the groups affected by the change are on benefits such as carers' allowance. Most of the borough's poorest and vulnerable are being expected to pay for the mismanagement and poor decision-taking which led to the council going bankrupt. It seems that the books will be balanced on the backs and necks of residents on low incomes. More than two-thirds of those who currently receive some level of discount on their Council Tax will lose that help from April 2022; which is apparently estimated to be 20,000 households. 



Croydon has at least 23,000 employees earning less than the London Living wage yet your proposals will affect the working

poor composed mostly of either working class people or ethnic minority groups. You claim that the new system "continues to prioritise the lowest income households in our community" but people who are over 18 and out of work will still be faced with a 20 per cent cut to their Council Tax eligibility simply because they are of working age. There would be no consideration of whether they are on no pay because they're full-time carers, or whether they're on low pay because they need part-time jobs that fit with the school-run. At least 30 per cent of children in Croydon are living in poverty and their households haven't been considered by your new scheme; nor have you considered the cumulative impacts of the Universal Credit cut, the benefit cap and inflation. Disabled people who are able to work won't be considered part of the protected group, even though many disabled people require extra space in their homes for accessibility reasons or for carers to stay. Many of the disabled people in the workforce require flexible working or part-time hours, meaning their earning capacity is likely to be compromised. Disabled people, within or outside the workforce, are overrepresented among the poor and yet they're hardly "protected" in your proposals. Why is there no consideration of a working age adult being in low-paid work, or out of work, due to factors like having a baby or caring for a disabled relative? Many of the groups affected by the change are on benefits such as carers' allowance.



If the band thresholds remain fixed with time, then most people would eventually find themselves pushed into a higher income band. This would mean facing the prospect of suddenly receiving substantially less council tax support despite not receiving an equivalent, real increase in income, whilst also having to deal with an ever increasing council tax bill plus rises in other day-to-day costs. Such problems are inherent to an income band approach and are one more reason as to why the proposed changes need to be reconsidered. At present, the above scenario would only be a particular problem for residents whose weekly wage is just below the threshold of the next highest income band. This proposal will affect circa 15,000 households in Croydon (according to information given at a consultation event. But this figure appeared to be based on existing working age caseloads and the Council's test system to identify households was not at that time up and running so it is not clear how accurate this figure is). The consultation period is only 6 weeks, but the LGA best practice guidance suggests that authorities should plan for up to 6 to 12 weeks for a consultation exercise. - consultations of the level of impact anticipated by these proposals should run for 12 weeks. 2. Whilst the consultation is open to respondents including those visiting, and those not living or working in the Borough, engagement with stakeholders does not appear to have focused on those residents most affected by the changes. 3. We do have concerns about how the authority engaged directly with those likely affected households since the preference for an on-line submission is likely to exclude many disadvantaged people - telephone or post options for feedback were not published on the website. 4. Financial pressures on low income households is already severe, particularly following the recent loss of the Universal Credit

uplift, the significant increases in energy prices and the increase in the cost of living people experience every week in their supermarket shopping baskets. The proposal will push struggling households into debt or further into debt. 5. The CAB's statistical data for the last quarter (July to September) already shows Council Tax Arrears as the top debt issue we are dealing with. This is surely set to increase with a reduction in CTS and with the financial pressures mentioned above (4) taking hold. Fuel debts are rent arrears (private landlords) are the next biggest issues we deal with. 6. Fully accredited advice services are underfunded in Croydon. Despite having the second largest population in London, the CAB is one of the smallest in London. Quality assured, accredited advice across all advice areas is essential. The biggest providers of Welfare Rights advice were, until recently, the Council's own Welfare Rights Unit and the CAB. With the loss of the former, no additional resource to the CAB, and indeed the prospect of cuts to the voluntary sector, there are real concerns about how families affected by these proposals are going to get the welfare benefits advice, budgeting and income maximisation advice and debt advice that they need. 7. Without the right advice affected households are more likely to be unable to pay their new, higher council tax bills, are more likely to fall behind on rent payments, potentially leading to homelessness, are more likely to fall behind with other bills - utility, fuel bills etc and be subject to more stress and anxiety affecting mental and physical health. 8. We are concerned that some families already unable to pay bills/in arrears are being directed by LA officers to seek loans from the Credit Union. Whilst the Credit Union movement is very much supported, we have certainly seen examples of clients getting into further debt and for whom taking on a CU loan is not the best solution to their financial situation. 9. It remains unclear exactly what will count as income when calculating CTS eligibility. In terms of the public consultation document it states "earned income" but there appears to be a suggestion that this will include income from some welfare benefits. This situation needs urgent clarification and if welfare benefit income is to be included, this will clearly increase the number of people affected by these CTS proposals. It also throws into question the integrity of the consultation itself, since there will be many people who will have thought these proposals didn't affect them as they believed only income from work would count. 10. Households earning over £23,400 are ineligible for CTS yet this still may include those on UC due to childcare and rent costs. 11. There is a lack of clarity over the administration and promotion of the Hardship Fund. This is an integral part of the Council's response to protect residents affected by CTS changes. At the consultation event, Council staff were unable to clarify who would provide support to residents and what support would be provided. Crucially, there appeared to be no plans to promote the scheme and it appears to rely on residents making contact with the Council. 12. The CTS changes will affect some of the lowest income households

in the borough, including cares and lone parents of children under 5 years old, and are likely, therefore, to disproportionately affect women. 13. It is not clear if the Authority has conducted an Equalities Impact Assessment for these proposals.




Q20 What age are you?


What best describes your gender?




