Thank you for your e-mail of 25 November 2015, in which you ask for the number of police officers investigated, charged, convicted and imprisoned under s.26 of the Criminal Justice and Courts Act 2015. Your request has been handled as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The Home Office does not hold the information that you have requested. The Home Office does not collect information on the number of police officers that have been investigated, charged, convicted or imprisoned for specific offences. The Home Office collects information on the number of crime outcomes recorded by the police, including the number of offences that have led to a charge or summons. These are published in the outcomes open data tables: <https://www.gov.uk/government/statistics/police-recorded-crime-open-data-tables>. The data identify the offence classification but the specific legislation under which the charge was brought cannot be identified. Individual police forces, the Crown Prosecution Service or the Ministry of Justice may hold some of this information.

If you are dissatisfied with this response you may request an independent internal review of our handling of your request by submitting a complaint within two months to the address below, quoting reference FOI 37674. If you ask for an internal review, it would be helpful if you could say why you are dissatisfied with the response.
