Environmental Information Regulations 2004 – 3730037

Thank you for your request for information, which we received on 5 April 2018 and processed under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIR). The EIR offers the same parallel access to information as the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act.

You requested:

"Any record held by the Ministry (and its predecessor DCLG), or the Planning Inspectorate PINS, of the first date on which the Report of Mr Philip Major into the Dunsfold Application dated 17 October 2017, or its recommendation, was communicated (in writing or orally) to the Inspector of the Waverley Local Plan."

I can confirm that the information requested is held by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government and we are able to provide you with all this information.

The first time that the Waverley Local Plan Inspector, Jonathan Bore, knew about the Dunsfold recommendation was when the Secretary of State published his decision letter on the Dunsfold case on 29 March 2018, which is when the report of the Inspector, Philip Major, was put into the public domain.
