Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA)

Thank you for your request, which was received on 19 November, for the following information:

"Ok so would it therefore be possible to just find out how many fit criteria G without splitting it into categories A B E F nor D?"

I can confirm HMRC holds information falling within scope of your request. However, we estimate that it would exceed the FOIA cost limit to deal with it. The cost limit, which is specified in regulations, equates to one person spending $3\frac{1}{2}$ working days locating and extracting all of the information within scope of the request.

Normally, HMRC would explore with you how you might be able to narrow or refine your request so that it did not exceed the FOIA cost limit. However, in this case, I cannot see any scope for doing this.

As confirmed in our previous reply; to establish the number of applicants who meet any of the cases, as outlined in <u>Regulation 9 of The Working Tax Credit Regulations 2002</u>, would require individual analysis of all tax credit claims where applicants are receiving the disability element of Working Tax Credit. Records of which customers fit each criteria is not kept as there is no business need to do so and this is the case for those customers who fit criteria G.

I have established that the time necessary to complete this task would exceed the cost limit by some way. Consequently, under section 12(1) of the FOIA, HMRC is not obliged to comply with your request and we will not be processing it further.
