Dear Caolan Wiggins,

Thank you for your emails of 13 and 17 December 2019, requesting the following information:

"I have a question regarding the role of the RAF Force Protection Police who are both reserves and full time personnel.

As part of their role as RAF Police officers, are they trained on firearms that the regular military use.

Secondly, does the RAF police carry out duties with firearms to protect RAF establishments like airbases just like other branches of the military?"

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

The information you have requested can be found below, I have answered each question in turn:

As part of their role as RAF Police officers, are they trained on firearms that the regular military use.

Yes, RAF Police Officers are trained to use the same firearms as other RAF personnel.

Secondly, does the RAF police carry out duties with firearms to protect RAF establishments like airbases just like other branches of the military?

Yes, however this is not a duty exclusively undertaken by the RAF Police; RAF personnel employed on armed/armed security duties may be drawn from any trade or branch within the RAF.

Also, if suitably trained and qualified, RAF Reserve personnel may be armed and utilised for general security duties inside Defence installations and at off-base sites that require armed guarding.
