14. ECAA Section 2 Score of each applicant
15. UCAS form/Personal Statement/Reference scores (if such scores exist) for each applicant
16. Indicate whether each applicant was shortlisted for interview
17. Interview Scores of each applicant
18. The college applied to by each applicant
19. Indicate whether an applicant received an offer
20. The college assigned after reallocation to each applicant where applicable
21. The percentage of number of applicants shortlisted for interview who received offers
22. The mean, minimum and maximum interview score of successful applicants*
