- Data provided should not be used to determine the likelihood of receiving an offer of a place at Warwick.
- Application data is for applicants who applied for entry to academic years 2019/20, 2020/21, 2021/22 and 2022/23.
- UECA-3 Economics cluster are 3-year Bachelor of Science courses in the Economics department. This includes BSc Economics and BSc Economics and Industrial

Organisation. Courses cannot be separated in the data however the BSc Economics receives the majority of applications in the cluster.

- Data may include applicants that deferred from a previous cycle.
- To calculate number off offer holders who did not take Further Mathematics A-level, subtract “Total Offers with Further Mathematics A-level” from “Total Offers”.
- Data includes both home and overseas applicants taking a wide range of qualifications.
- Total Offers with Further Maths A-level refers to the total number of applicants who received an offer who had indicated they were taking Further Mathematics A-level in their UCAS application.
- Applicants taking A-levels are required to be taking Mathematics A-level. Further Mathematics A-level is not a compulsory requirement.
