Dear Mr Jones,

Thank you for your email dated 14 July 2018, which asked for the following information:

Following the Red Arrow accident, involving the death of Flt Lt Cunningham, it was recommended that modifications should be made to the ejection seat safety pin and the Seat Pan Firing Handle (SPFH). Can you advise me as what modifications were finalised, and if they have now been embodied?

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). A search has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD), and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

I can advise that Martin-Baker produced a new design of SPFH Housing which has an increased front profile to cover the front exposed face of the Firing Handle through which the Safety Pin is inserted. The modified SPFH Housing is designed to eliminate the possibility of inserting the Safety Pin when the Handle is in the partially withdrawn condition, which was possible with the unmodified Housing. The modified design also prevents routing of the harness straps to the side of the housing.

The unmodified and modified SPFH Housings are shown in Annex A.

All of the in-service operational Type 10 series of Ejection Seats have had this modification embodied; this includes Hawk TMk1 & TMk2, Tucano and Tornado.
