Freedom of Information Act 2000

1. Please advise how many chargers Kent county council have sanctioned or authorised.

KCC does not 'sanction' chargers but was involved in the installation of 45 chargers as detailed below:

30 off-street chargers in car parks, working in partnership with the Districts.

14 chargers awarded to businesses to install them on their premises

1 On-street charger (privately funded and operated to test the technology)

2. The towns that have chargers in Kent sanctioned by the council and the number in each town.

KCC does not 'sanction' chargers. The 30 off street chargers in car parks are located as below.

3. Was the purpose of them for private vehicle owners or to be blocked by local authorities for their own vehicles.

All chargers have been installed to increase the visibility of charge points in the county in partnership with the District councils. Some chargers are for the use of staff during the week and available to the public in the evenings and weekends.

4. When did KCC stop sanctioning additional charging units to be fitted.

5. Is it acceptable for a local authority not to sanction the repair of chargers within their jurisdiction- Ramsgate have been out of service approx. 3 months.

6. How many electric vehicles are registered for use by Kent county council.

Highways, Transportation and Waste acquired a pool car fleet of eight hybrid vehicles and has the intention to purchase more hybrid/EVs in the near future. We also have a carpooling scheme set up which is open to KCC staff during working hours, as well as to the public on evenings and weekends. This scheme provides two hybrid vehicles in Maidstone to help enable business travel to be done with a hybrid, and also to continue to encourage and allow those travelling by public transport or by carsharing to still have access to a car for business if necessary.

7. How many applications for charging points has KCC refused.

Any person with off-street parking on their property may install a charging point without approval from KCC. However, there is no set process yet for managing applications to have an on-street charger installed. We have therefore had no applications and hence no refusals. KCC is working on an EV Strategy to ensure there is a consistent, safe and viable process towards installing chargers on Highway land in the future.
