In addition, four candidates who had applied to other colleges have been made a conditional offer to study at Magdalene through the winter pool – these candidates have not been included in the data below as they did not apply to Magdalene.

Additional notes:

- 1) Data is for A levels only. All grade profiles represented are given, but without the numbers of each in order to avoid sharing personal data. Some candidates have not offered any A levels, or have offered A levels in combination with other examinations at a similar level. Data for other examinations offered, such as the International Baccalaurate (IB), are not given as the numbers of candidates concerned are very small and so to do so would risk the disclosure of personal data.
- 3) Not all candidates have subjects listed, and different exam systems have very different numbers of subjects. All subjects listed have been included in the data (in some cases a candidate may have listed more than one aspect of a single subject, such as physics). The numbers studying each subject have not been given to avoid sharing personal data.
- 4) and 6) Mean and range (in brackets) are given as to give individual scores would risk the sharing of personal data of candidates and /or interviewers. Not all candidates took the ENGAA or were interviewed and therefore the information does not cover all candidates. Numbers have been rounded to one decimal place.
