REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: Xylella

Thank you for your request for information of 21 May 2019 about Xylella arriving in the UK. We have handled your request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIRs).

The EIRs apply to requests for environmental information, which is a broad category of information defined in regulation 2 of the EIRs. Public Authorities are required to handle requests for environmental information under the EIRs. They give similar access rights to the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

The information you requested and our response is detailed below.

"What estimations have been made of the financial damage to the UK, to the horticulture industry, and wider gardening sector, including impacts to garden tourism have been made should Xyllela arrive in the UK."
