**Response to M. Brindley**

**Ethnic monitoring of Gypsies and Travellers by Hampshire PCT**

**Extract from the results of the 'Everyone Counts' patient survey carried out by Hampshire PCT**

Hampshire Primary Care Trust (PCT) carried out an 'Everyone Counts' patient survey during January 2012 linked to the implementation of the NHS Equality Delivery System. The report that analyses the survey results includes the following extracts that are relevant to this FOI request:

Whilst Black and Minority Ethnic patients were not significantly more likely to report that they had specific additional needs, they were less likely to feel that the GP practice met these needs. This was particularly the case in the Gypsy or Irish Traveller group; four of the six respondents indicated they had learning difficulties, none felt that the GP practice sufficiently responded to these needs.
