Thank you for your Freedom of Information request received 10 August. You asked;

When receiving confirmation that benefit is to be paid, the confirmation also states ~ I quote ~ 'How much the law says you need to live on 'end quote.

Please can you detail specifically what sections of law are used in the assessments made by the DWP to come to the conclusion/total of benefit arrived at?

I refer you to Regulations 79 and 82 in the Jobseeker's Allowance Regulations 1996. These set out in 1996 the amount that an individual would need to live on, and that figure has been uprated each year by the Uprating Order: http://www.dwp.gov.uk/docs/a11-4001.pdf

The amount is intended to cover day-to-day living expenses. In addition, in setting the rates of benefit the Government takes account of the competing demands on public expenditure and work incentives. Benefit rates are not an aggregate of separate amounts for specific items of expenditure such as food or fuel charges. The Government has not prescribed what expenses the personal allowances cover as it is for each individual or family unit to decide how to spend their benefit, in the light of their individual needs and preferences.
