Reference to "tiers" has been dropped and in particular tier 2 has been dropped from the current version with a proposed new consultation on Tier2 and an update to the guidance published in around 12 months time.	
Altimeter based priorities emphasises the priority of Noise from 4,000ft to <7000ft	
Airspace modernisation; NATS delivering an interim South East airspace report to DfT in the next 2 months. Primary legislation is being considered to ensure the right incentives and support is in place to deliver airspace modernisation.	
ICAAN is still being considered, and will likely be a non government department agency; it will not be part of the CAA.	
FAS Refresh and Governance
