Thank you for your request for information received on 21st December 2017 and clarified on 7th January 2018. I apologise for the slight delay in providing our response.

We have considered this request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Your request

Please advise how much the council spend per clearance on fly-tipping per annum and over the last three years, plus the cost of purchasing and installing safety bollards - per bollard.

I understand the council installs more than one type of bollard depending on its purpose and location, so I would like to understand the cost of all the different types of bollards you install, with their allocated purposes too please against each cost. Also included could I have the cost for installation as well as the cost of the actual bollards.

Our Response

The different types of safety bollard used by Lambeth Council are listed below, alongside their cost. Please note that the costs provided are inclusive of installation.

Safety bollards are used for the following reasons:

- Protect the footway and highway structures
- Pedestrian safety
- Stop driving in to verges
- Separating footpath and carriageway

Unfortunately, it is not possible to provide information about council spend on clearance of fly tipping because it is not held as a disaggregated figure. It is included in the cost of general street cleaning and no separate figure is held.
