		JR asked about weed spraying of target wards and after discussion it was decided that the 10/12 identified roads in Kilburn would be sprayed and that Dan Kelly would inform AS what roads he would be spraying and on what day and time as agreed in their documented meeting on 7 th September.	
		JfM asked MOB if the management of the weeds (North Brent) was an improvement on last year and MOB responded, "No". JfM noted his surprise at this comment and that in his opinion weed spraying this year probably wasn't a good idea as StreetCare haven't noticed a difference.	
		MOB informed JfM that due the amount of weeds that it would be	

quicker to dig out the weeds in the 4 target wards in the North than to wait for the spraying to take effect. This decision was made solely on the amount of weeds and the need to remove them before the next traunche that could happen any time up to the end of November.

There was a general discussion between the benefits of spraying and digging out the weeds. JfM voiced the opinion that the original idea was to eliminate weed spraying after the first year of the contract. JR and MOB agreed that this was true so long as it wasn't detrimental to the cleanliness of Brent and that this cleanliness is measured by the BV199 and now the NI195 scores.

It was noted that the score for the first traunche for this year wasn't good and it was necessary to considerably improve on this score for the next two traunches to maintain the good combined score of last year. Unfortunately the three times a week sweeping of Zone 5 roads wasn't being reflected in the lack of weeds and it was questioned whether actual sweeping did take place 3 days every week.

JfM commented that the contract states that Veolia must manage the weeds. If there are any complaints Veolia must remove the weeds as quickly as possible. Spraying roads can only help Veolia to slow down weed growth. JfM felt it important to review results of Traunche One before discussing the next inspection.

7(d) Missed Collections

JR supplied statistical data with graphical representation. The improvement in all missed collections was noted and to target another 50% would bring about the improvement needed to reach Government targets.

7(d)i Domestic Refuse

There were 99 reported missed collections compared to 143 the previous week. The 30% reduction was noted and MOB and JR asked EB to praise all the crews and supervisors for their good work in getting to grips with the new schedules.

7(d)ii Green Box

There were 55 reported missed collections compared to 91 the previous week. The 40% reduction was noted and MOB and JR asked DL to praise all the crews and supervisors for their good work in managing the new schedules.

	8(b)v	Final Destination of Contaminated Estate Bins and Banks There was a discussion surrounding the disposal of contaminated banks and estate bins between DL, MOB and JR. Points believed worthy of note were: There was an estimation of up to 3 tonnes of contaminated waste going to landfill every week from estate bins and banks. DL agreed to try to get accurate figures. The vast majority of items in the contaminated banks/bins could be treated as co-mingled for recycling purposes. This could be up to 95% (DL estimation) of 156 tonnes not being added annually (148 tonnes) to our recycling figures if it went through a MERF. Brent would still retain our clean paper, glass, cans and plastic collections. The expected transfer and gate fee on the MERF (if shared with Camden/Westminster) may make a small saving on landfill. With some re-organisation and co-operation with other Veolia clients Brent could increase their recycling at no extra cost (maybe a small decrease in costs and landfill tax is increasing) and still maintain their 'clean' kerbside recycling until the time id right for co-mingled collections across the Borough. DL agreed to find out more tonnages and costings and a more in depth discussion could be had with an accurate business plan being the output for presentation to StreetCare and Veolia senior management.
