While the aim is to divert landfill to recycling, this is always difficult in blocks of flats as bring sites are invariably contaminated by residents.	
4(j)	North Circular Road Cleansing – 18/1/2011 MOB – Brent need a positive update as these areas need cleaning pro-actively by Veolia on the scheduled 7 day service rather than an ad-hoc response to Brent raising the issue. Veolia should be aware that Keith Balmer (Head of Service) has the option of bringing in another company and billing Veolia if standards do not improve.
