FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST - REFERENCE NO: 004482/19

I write in connection with your request for information which was received by Derbyshire Constabulary on 09/09/2019. I note you seek access to the following information:

Definition of terms for clarity:

Homicide – The unlawful killing of a person, to include murder and all categories of manslaughter.

Detected homicide case – a solved homicide case whereby a person(s) has been charged or has died prior to charges being brought.

Undetected homicide case – a currently unsolved homicide case.

Undetected homicide case review – the review of all evidence in relation to an undetected homicide case.

Freedom of Information Questions:

- 1. How many reported undetected homicide cases are there within your jurisdiction currently?
- 2. Do you currently have a team solely responsible for the review of undetected homicides?
- 3. What is the current standard undetected homicide case review frequency within your jurisdiction?
- 4. During the years 2011 2014 (inclusive), how many undetected homicide cases were reviewed within your jurisdiction?
- 5. During the years 2011 2014 (inclusive), how many undetected homicide cases were detected within your jurisdiction?
- 6. Does your jurisdiction currently have a Forensic Archaeologist to be called upon as required?
- 7. During the years 2011 2014 (inclusive), how many undetected homicide case reviews utilised Forensic Archaeology?
- 8. During the years 2011 2014 (inclusive), how many undetected homicide cases were detected as a result of Forensic Archaeology?





Result of Searches

Following receipt of your request, searches were conducted within Derbyshire Constabulary to locate any relevant information. The searches located some information relevant to your request.

4.5.2 Timing of reviews

The timings of the statutory, multi-agency reviews are dictated by guidance as referred to under section 4.3 above.

In respect of 28 day undetected reviews, in general, if a case has not been detected after twenty-eight days from the outset of the enquiry a review should commence at the earliest opportunity. However in exceptional cases there may be good reasons to delay a review, for example, disruption to a critical phase of the investigation. Under these circumstances a written record of the reasons for delaying the review should be made in the SIO's Decision log.

As a minimum, all undetected murders should be reviewed at least every two years.

The review should be an on-going process, preferably using the same review officer. The frequency with which interim review reports are prepared is a matter of judgement for the relevant commissioning ASCPO officer.

And of course undetected homicides are reviewed as appropriate based on the intelligence available in that case, on any new information received or when there are forensic opportunities or developments available.

- 5. There were a total of 35 homicides recorded between 2011 and 2014 (inclusive). Of these 34 individuals have been charged (therefore detected) with the remaining one having an open verdict.
