





- 1. .Has this power been used? Yes
- 2. If so, on how many services / how many times? The power has been used in relation to 226 matters for the issuing of notices relating to registration, variation of conditions of registration and enforcement action. The number of notices issued will be greater than that as some of the processes concerned involve the issue of two notices. These processes may have commenced before the changes to s101, and we cannot, without disproportionate effort, identify the total number of individual notices involved
- 3. .What is the Care Inspectorate's experience of this (e.g., has this been beneficial, essential, etc.)? This has been an important legislative change from the point of view of the Care Inspectorate. During the COVID-19 pandemic our offices have been closed (and remain so). We have been unable to access printers to enable hard copy correspondence to be issued. Even if we had been able to do so, the accessing of postal services would have been difficult and it would have been even more difficult to justify using the only alternative (but for this change) of effecting the giving of notice by hand delivery which would have necessitated face-to-face contact. In the absence of this change, the Care Inspectorate would have delivered formal notices by email and would have argued strongly that that did constitute effective delivery but that argument may not have succeeded in the event of challenge. The amendments introduced put the position beyond doubt.
- 4. .Views on whether (or how long) this provision should remain in place? These provisions need to remain in place for as long as there is not near-normal office access and access to postal services. That said, there is a strong argument that these provisions should remain in place indefinitely we live in a society where online interaction is regarded as the norm and where the Care Inspectorate is progressing arrangements to move as much as possible of its interactions online, including, for example, its registration processes. It seems entirely misplaced that we may reach a point where an entire registration application, for example, can be conducted online, but cannot be determined other than by the issuing of a paper notice. The permanent retention of the amended s101 would serve only to bring the position as regards the issuing of notices by the Care Inspectorate up to date with current expectations. Similarly, the changes to the identities of individuals to whom a notice intended for a body corporate may be given, is an essential change from the point of view of updating s101 to make it fit for purpose in today's environment, regardless of the COVID-19 pandemic, so should be retained for as long as is possible, and preferably indefinitely.

Fortnightly Report to Parliament

What is the Care Inspectorate's experience of this (e.g., has this been beneficial, essential, etc.)?

There were significant challenges in meeting the timescales from the point where the legislation was introduced. It has required us to develop and implement new processes to be able to do this. There have been clear advantages in taking a more targeted, intelligence-led and risk-based approach, working collaboratively with HSCPs, clinical oversight teams, public health teams and Healthcare Improvement Scotland in both sharing information to prioritise services for inspection and in undertaking the inspections themselves. Where we have identified serous concerns in services, returning quickly to check and report on improvements, often more than once, has provided powerful evidence of the value of robust, independent scrutiny and assurance, the diagnostic element of scrutiny and most importantly the improvement that directly arises from it. This is a point often debated by academics, but this process has provided unequivocal evidence that scrutiny supports improvement and is an improving activity in its own right, where inspectors spend time not only identifying strengths and areas for improvement, but providing advice, guidance and support and 'signposting' best practice.

This process has also been helpful in getting information into the public domain more quickly to provide assurance to ministers, parliament and the public at a time where levels of anxiety about the safety and wellbeing of care home residents is understandably high. It has enabled us to highlight more quickly the valuable work we have been doing. That said, there are aspects that are less helpful. It is impossible to include the detail that would normally appear in an inspection report in the fortnightly parliamentary report. As result, it not always as clear why certain evaluations (grades) have been given, particularly when comparing the findings in different services that appear 'side by side' in the same report. A more detailed description is often required to make that clear. The timescales for publication do not allow us to adhere to our normal protocols of allowing sufficient time for providers to comment on the factual accuracy of the report. That can sometimes can result in delays in publishing a public report which would have been inconsistent with the requirements of the emergency legislation to publish within two weeks. That does leave us open to challenge.

It also has to be remembered that the focus of these inspections is more prescriptive focusing as they do primarily on infection prevention and control, PPE, staffing, social distancing and the impact on wellbeing, although we do take any opportunity required to follow up previous requirements, recommendations or complaints.

Views on whether (or how long) this provision should remain in place?

As we ease out of lockdown and resume scrutiny and assurance activities across a wider range of services, it will be important to balance the public reporting to reflect the current situation. Whilst it is clearly a matter for Ministers to determine when to disengage the relevant provisions of the emergency legislation, we have prepared to continue with the current approach as long as required anticipating that might be until the end of August or the beginning of September.

On our experience of reporting on deaths of care home residents, Edith / provided the following information:-

Most care homes have continued to notify us of deaths promptly, and having this specifically set out in the legislation has been a useful reminder to care homes of the importance of doing this at a time when we, and others, have depended on accurate and timely reporting from care homes.

There is no evidence of the statistics we provide to Scottish Government being used to any great extent outwith Care Inspectorate and Scottish Government, which in part will be due to the considerable fall in numbers of deaths since the Act was introduced.

It may be helpful to continue to report weekly for the rest of 20/21 to provide transparency on deaths, and covid-related deaths in care homes while the threat from covid19 remains.

Over the rest of 20/21 death notifications will be a key element in our ongoing monitoring for any resurgence of covid19 and the specific legislation to underpin that removes any ambiguity that may have existed in the PSR Act. For this reason, it would be helpful to retain s79A until the threat from coronavirus has been substantially reduced.
