Your email dated 27<sup>th</sup> June 2017 is considered to be a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You requested the following information:

*I have recently bought an ex mod land rover defender 90 4x4 gs soft top wolf and i am requesting service/maintenance history for the defender if possible. The military registration number is LP69AA and the chassis number is SALLDAA67WA138715 and date into service was 09/07/1998*

I can confirm that the Ministry of Defence (MOD) holds information relevant to your request. Unfortunately, following the closure of MERLIN it is only possible to retrieve information held on the archived version of the database, which is attached.

This information supplied to you continues to be protected by copyright.
