University's Response

1. A list of all organisations within the fossil fuel industry the university received money from in the last 5 years, including the date, organisation, amount and what it was for, as an Excel spreadsheet.

The University does not hold information at this level, and would therefore have to look at all bank transactions for the last five years individually, to parse out the relevant income receipts. Therefore, the University has estimated that the cost of responding to your request will exceed the fee limit as set out in the Freedom of Information (Fees for Required Disclosure) (Scotland) Regulations 2004. As a result, we are not obliged to provide a response. The fee limit set down by the Regulations is £600, and in this instance this equates to staff time capped at a rate of £15 per hour. It is estimated that in order to reproduce the information requested would exceed the prescribed cost limit of £600.

Please be advised that a modified request will be given due consideration. Any modification of your request will be treated as a new request for the purposes of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

2. Numbers of graduates gaining employment broken down by employment sector, for the last 5 years as an Excel spreadsheet.

Please see Appendix A. Please be advised that the Destination of Leavers of Higher Education (DLHE) methodology has changed over the 5 year period.

The supply of documents under the terms of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 does not give the applicant or whoever receives the information any right to re-use it in such a way that might infringe the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988 (for example, by making multiple copies, publishing or otherwise distributing the information to other individuals and the public). Your right to seek a review
