Following our discussion on the costing model to complete Q14. I did have a discussion with about this as I talked to our Finance department about being able to provide some figures. Our concern was that the figures started to become meaningless when applying the template criteria and felt could not include. We would not pay employer pension contribution to a re-engaged officer as was shown on the proforma and I was not able to obtain details of our recruit training costs/abstractions. We are only then left with assumption (as you said) that we would use the bottom and top of each payscale which it was felt not a true reflection of costs. In Hertfordshire our cost savings are based around the retention of an officer which also reduced the vacancy gap. Sorry that not able to provide a number but felt that this would not really give you a credible figure on which to work on.
