Galleries – Tender Process

A three-stage competition was undertaken to procure a Strategic Development Partner:

Stage 1 - Selection Questionnaire:

The procurement process, via the Council's procurement portal "the Chest", started on 29 October 2019, when the Council advertised openly for formal expressions of interest, from parties wishing to work with the Council to implement the overarching vision for The Galleries. Interested parties completed a selection questionnaire. On the return date of 29 November 2019, a total of 49 companies had downloaded the selection questionnaire, of those, 6 companies formally expressed interest.

Stage 2 - Invited to Participate in Dialogue (ITPD) & Outline Solutions.

A shortlist of four Bidders were then invited to participate in the Stage 2 dialogue with the Council to develop Outline Solutions for the site.

- Eric Wright and Urban Splash
- Queensberry

The evaluation criteria that proposals were to be assessed against were set out in the invitation, as follows:

Submitted proposals were to be assessed against each criterion as follows:

A Bidder information day was held on 17 January 2020. The dialogue process then commenced with a series of meetings with each Bidder.

The deadline for Bidders to submit their outline solutions was 9 April 2020, shortly after lockdown was introduced in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The procurement process was paused for approximately two months due to the resource requirements of responding to the Covid-19 crisis. The process was then restarted in July 2020 with the evaluation of the outline solutions, using the criteria set out above. The three highest scoring Bidders were invited to proceed to the Detailed Solution/Final Tender stage.

Stage 3 - ITPD Detailed Solutions/Final Tender/Contract Award:

The Detailed Solutions Stage ran from August to September 2020. Again, a series of dialogue meetings were convened with the three shortlisted Bidders. The deadline for final Detailed Solutions submissions was 9 September 2020. The evaluation criteria used at the Outline Solution Stage were also used for the Detailed Solutions Stage, as the Procurement Regulations require.
