Question: For the information officer who give me this fleet information is that all the Police Vehicle in the Gloucestershire Constabulary Fleet or that just the vehicles you do know or able to get, meaning you don't know all of the Police Vehicles?

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 s1, I can confirm that Gloucestershire Constabulary holds no relevant information.

Gloucestershire Constabulary's current records management for vehicle documents means that any documents for vehicles that would be relevant to your request are no longer held. The retention period for this information is four years, therefore no information is held before January 2017.

If you are not satisfied with this response or any actions taken in dealing with your request, you have the right to ask that we review your case under our internal procedure. Please note that a request for an internal review must be made within 20 working days of the response to your original request.

If you decide to request that such a review is undertaken and following this process you are still unsatisfied, you then have the right to direct your complaint to the Information Commissioner for consideration.
