## **SCHEME**

### **1. Administration**

The charity identified at the beginning of this scheme is to be administered in accordance with its existing trusts as altered or affected by this scheme.

### **2. Sale of land**

The trustees of the charity may sell the land belonging to the charity and identified in the schedule to this scheme. They must comply with the restrictions on disposal imposed by section 36 of the Charities Act 1993, unless the sale is excepted from these restrictions by section 36(9)(b) or (c) or section 36(10) of that Act.

### **3. Application of proceeds of sale**

The proceeds of any such sale, including any income arising from their investment, must be used for the purpose of maintaining and repairing the cemetery owned by the charity.

### **4. Questions relating to the Scheme**

The Commissioners may decide any question put to them concerning:

- (1) the interpretation of this scheme: or
- (2) the propriety or validity of anything done or intended to be done under it.

## **SCHEDULE**

The land comprised in the following deeds excluding that part which has already been used as a cemetery:

- 1. A deed made on the 16th May 1842 between Thomas Oliver of the first part, David Mocatta of the second part, and Abraham Mocatta, Joseph Barrow Mocatta, Solomon Lazarus and Francis Henry Goldsmid of the third part.
- 2. A deed made on the 1st January 1869 between The North London Railway Company of the one part and Abraham Mocatta, Joseph Barrow Montefiore, Sir Francis Henry Goldsmid and Frederick Gutierrez Henriques of the other part.
