REQUEST UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002 AND THE ENVIRONMENTAL INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2004

We refer to the Freedom of Information request you submitted on 10 May 2019, in which you ask for the following information to be provided to you:

"Please provide a copy of the guidance issued to council staff in the use of plastics, including but not limited to the placing of laminated public notices attached to lampposts, the use of cable ties for that and other purposes, and the guidance on the removal of all such materials and avoidance of their loss and consequent environmental damage. When providing this information please confirm the date of issue and how the dissemination to staff who maybe performing such tasks is confirmed.

Further, please provide a copy of the checking process employed to monitor that all such plastic materials have been retrieved and accounted for once their use is finalised."

The Council considers that the information you have requested is environmental information in terms of the Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004 ("the EIRs"). This means that the information is exempt from disclosure under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 ("the Act") because of the exemption contained at section 39(2) of that Act.

We believe that it is more appropriate to consider your request under the specific regulatory regime provided for environmental information. Further, the Council is of the opinion that the public interest in considering your request for environmental information in accordance with the terms of the EIRs outweighs the public interest in disclosure of such information under the terms of the Act.

"Environmental information" is defined in Regulation 2(1) of the EIRs and includes measures (including administrative measures), such as policies, legislation, plans, programmes, environmental agreements, and activities affecting or likely to affect the elements of the environment (such as air and atmosphere, water, soil, land, landscape) and factors of the environment (such as substances, energy, noise, radiation of waste, including radioactive waste, emissions, discharges and other releases into the environment.

The Council's response to your enquiry is detailed below.

The Council has a statutory duty to display notices in regard to Traffic Regulation Orders and Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders for specified periods, and we tend to display laminated notices using plastic cable ties because of their robustness.

The Glasgow City Council Permanent Traffic Regulation Order Procedures and Guidance document contains the following spreadsheet that is to be used if notices have been placed on-street.

Roads and Traffic engineers, inspectors and technicians are expected to remove all laminated notices and cable ties which are no longer required (or which have not been authorised by the Council) in the course of their duties.

By way of advice and assistance, we can advise that the Council's Neighbourhoods and Sustainability are currently drafting a plastics reduction strategy and action plan for the city, which will address issues relating to the waste hierarchy of reducing, reusing and recycling materials, and will also specifically consider the issue of single use plastics. This plastics strategy will relate to the Glasgow City Council estate and the wider city, and is due to be published before the end of this year.

Right of Review

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which we have dealt with your request for information, you are entitled under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 and / or the Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004 to require the Council to review its response. Please note that for a review to take place you must:

- Lodge a written requirement for a review within 40 working days of the date of this letter
- Include a correspondence address, a description of the original request and the reason why you are dissatisfied
- Address your request to the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council:

You will receive notice of the results of the review within 20 working days of receipt of your request. The notice will state the decision reached by the reviewing officer as well as details of how to appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner if you are still dissatisfied with the Council's response. You must request an internal review by the Council before a complaint can be directed to the Scottish Information Commissioner.

For your information at this stage, if you do remain dissatisfied with the outcome of the Council's review decision, an appeal can be made to the Scottish Information Commissioner by contacting his office as follows -

Please note that you cannot make an appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner until you have first requested an internal review by the Council.
