



## What's this document about?

It provides guidance on the production of a plan to control the risks associated with people and plant working together. It details the considerations necessary to produce and establish a safe people/plant interface on site.

The good practice example in this document demonstrates how a plan can be used to make clear, plant /vehicle operating areas, and segregation of pedestrians and site staff.

## Must do actions

A People and Plant Co-ordination Plan should be produced where people and plant will be working together. It will include methods of communication between plant and equipment operators and pedestrian site staff.

**! Important** - If it is decided that a plan is not required, the rationale for this decision must be documented. i.e. relevant controls already detailed within a maintenance schedule.
